

Translation of Little Domesday Book Folio 397v

SUFFOLK

In **Wimundestuna** 6 free men. Regarding the sixth who is called Beorhtric, the Hundred does not know if he could sell his land or not TRE but it testifies that they saw him swear that he could not give [nor] sell his land away from Richard's predecessor. They have 2 carucates of land 11 acres. Then as now 2 ploughs. 7 acres of meadow. Now 2 horses. Then 2 cows, now 3. Then 6 pigs, now 30. Then 16 sheep, now 62. The whole is worth 40s. Gerald holds this.

HALF-HUNDRED OF COSFORD.

In **Hitcham** 14 free men with 60 acres. Then 2 ploughs, now 1; 2 acres of meadow. It is worth 10s .

In **Lindsey** 6 free men with 1 carucate of land. 6 bordars. 2 ploughs. 2 acres of meadow. It is worth 20s.

In **Kersey** 1 free [man] with 5 acres, worth 10d. His predecessor had the soke and commendation.

In **Brettenham** 8 free men with 30 acres. 1 plough. It is worth 5s .

In **Rushbrooke** 2 free men with 10 acres, worth 20d .

In **Whatfield** 3 free men with 60 acres. 3 bordars. Then 1½ ploughs, now 2. It is worth 10s. Over these men his predecessor had the commendation TRE and the soke and sake. St Edmund had the 6 forfeitures.

In **Stone Street** 1 free man with 24 acres, worth 4s. His predecessor had half the commendation and [...] the Abbot of Ely had the other half. Ralph Peverel claims half this land it was delivered to him in **Loose**. St Edmund had the soke.
